### Housing construction and sales

A milestone has been achieved with the submission of the development application with Campbelltown City Council to upgrade Dimeny Park. We are one step closer to creating a better recreational space for the community.

Construction works for Stage 11 are continuing, while further site investigations for Stages 4 is underway. We are on track for remediation and construction works to begin in mid-2024. We anticipate the start of construction for Stage 5 will begin this month with environmental controls before moving onto civil works. Completion of these works are anticipated by mid-2025. The latest sales release of lots was held on 4 May 2024.

### What is remediation?

Remediation means identifying and cleaning up contaminated materials so that it is safe for residential and other uses.

The annual Easter in Claymore event was a success – with warm weather and a great turnout. The community enjoyed food, ice cream, kid's activities, games and more!


